Last words

Odessa has become less foreign to me over the past four years, the Soviet regime of the seventies and Joseph's extended family have become more familiar.

I now own a couple of Osip Mandelstam's poetry books and a copy of Nadezhda Mandelstam's great work Hope Abandoned.

I was lucky enough to meet Michael Sherman, Joseph's father, in the home where he died and sit with him and Rebecca, Joseph's mother, in her upstairs bedroom, he laying on the bed, she unsure of who exactly he was.

Mining this history and crafting this show with Joseph, being led by his passion through the political, artistic and cultural labyrinth that is his life has deeply enriched mine.

I hope that we have served the story well so that you can appreciate Joseph's generosity and skill, the complexity and ambiguity of his relationship to Russia and the love he holds for his parents.

I have worked with Christopher Bolton on several occasions. His musical virtuosity and sensitivity to subject matter are impeccable, his respect for his collaborators, an inspiration.

CHRISTOPHER MARLOW BOLTON

Music Composition

Christopher is a Melbourne composer, songwriter, and musician. Bolton has performed music for independent theatre since childhood. Bolton has composed for productions such as Three Sisters, Uncle Vanya (Metanoia Productions), Last Words, What a Joy to be Alive (Sticky Fingers Theatre) and The Tempest. Bolton is also the chief songwriter of Melbourne band Seagull, releasing five albums to local and international acclaim, and building a dedicated fanbase over the past decade.

JOHN BOLTON Director

John has been acting, teaching and directing since 1974. He co-directed Artworks and Theatre Workshop in Edinburgh, and acted with Welfare State in England and Canada. In 1991 he founded his own school in Melbourne, and was later Head of Acting at the Victorian College of the Arts where he received the 2005 Teaching Excellence Award. A Fellow of The Australia Council, recipient of the 2002 Kenneth Myer Medallion for Services to Theatre in Victoria. he has received numerous awards for direction including two Green Room awards for best direction and best Production at La Mama (My Brother the Fish). His shows have been invited to theatre festivals throughout the world including the main stages of Melbourne, Adelaide, Hong Kong, Dublin International Festivals and The Barbican International Theatre Event, London. He has been Director of movement for shows at S.T.C. and M.T.C. as well as running workshops for many of Australia's leading theatre companies.

BRIAN LIPSON Set Design

Brian has worked in theatre for fifty years. Studied Theatre Design at London's Central School of Art; resident designer Watford Palace; head of design Cockpit Theatre; also designed for Lindsey Kemp, Ballet Rambert, etc. In 1970s and 80s was key member of three experimental companies: Lumiere and Son, Rational Theatre and Hidden Grin - working as performer, actor,

designer and writer. Later acted regularly at National Theatre, Old Vic, Royal Court, etc.

Moved to Melbourne in 1997 and acts often with MTC, Malthouse, STC, Belvoir, Bell Shakespeare etc, plus many independent companies. Brian designed and performed in all 4 Inotrope collaborations with St Kilda Drop in Centre. He wrote, designed and performed: A Large Attendance in the Antechamber (worldwide tour); Berggasse 19 – The Apartments of Sigmund Freud (Melbourne Festival); directed and designed Harry Harlow Project (Victorian Arts Centre and national tour); Song of the Bleeding Throat (Eleventh Hour), and many productions for VCA. Co-directed Apocalypse Bear Trilogy (MTC). Directed, cowrote and designed Love, Death, Music and Plants (Melbourne Botanic Gardens).

Nominated for 8 Green Room Awards and won 4. Received Australia Council Fellowship 2011. Currently touring *EDMUND*. *THE BEGINNING* and *Two Jews walk into a theatre*... (with Gideon Obarzanek.

EMMIE TURNER Stage Manager/Operator

Emmie is the lighting technician of *Last Words*. Emmie completed a Diploma of Live Production and Technical Services in 2017 after moving away from her home in Darwin.

Emmie has worked as lighting designer for original Australian screenplay's *Echo* (2018), *Bully Virus* (2018), *Flash Donahs* (2018), *XI Visions* (2017), and *Playhouse Passions* (2017). She was the director and audiovisual designer for the immersive set piece production *After Dark: Dreams* (2017), and theatre technician for the cabaret *Club Provocaré* (2018).
