# LA MAMA: THE NEXT CHAPTER

What a time we have had since that momentous phone call I received at 6.30am on Saturday morning the 19th May from the police. Something feared for so long, it had become an unlikely abstract abruptly becoming a vivid reality!

How to survive, how to be strong, how to remain positive all suddenly becoming daily challenges. We have struggled! But we have been able to keep the creative spirit alive. All productions that wanted to continue have continued and we need to thank The Butterfly Club, the David Williamson Theatre, The Guild Theatre, Arts House, The Brunswick Mechanics Institute, Dancehouse and the Richmond Uniting Church for contributing to keeping our Autumn Season alive.

Our Winter and Spring seasons will operate out of La Mama Courthouse and Trades Hall in Lygon St. Our office will run out of the La Mama Courthouse foyer.

We are working towards our longterm goal of restoring our beloved "headquarters" in Faraday St Carlton. In moving towards this we have been assisted with great generosity by Allan Willingham preparing the "scope of works" for the insurance company. We are also delighted to announce that Meg White, who will be known to so many of you as a vital member of the La Mama family, has been appointed co-ordinating architect for this exciting project of La Mama renewal into the future.

We see the devastation of the recent fire as an opportunity to make La Mama a fully accessible and more workable space, and plan to build a separate office and front of house area on ground level. Rebuilding La Mama will be our focus for the next two years and will be a carefully managed process, honouring the past and dreaming for the future. We will keep alive the spirit of La Mama, the simplicity, the modesty, but will also be making the theatrical home for the next generations of artists.

To assist in this process we have appointed two new staff members: Xanthe Beesley and Tim Stitz and we have brought Bec Etchell back to help create a temporary theatre space at Trades Hall.

We have so many people for their support: to Message Consultants and Holding Redlich for their legal support, to Trades Hall for hosting us for our Winter and Spring season; to Kathleen Syme Centre, Trotters and other cafes around Melbourne that have provided us coffee and wi fi in our homelessness. Thank you to all the individuals who have helped make our new Courthouse office home, with generous donations coming in from all corners. Thank you to those who donated goods to make the Trades Hall space as much La Mama theatre as we could: Polyglot, Lucy

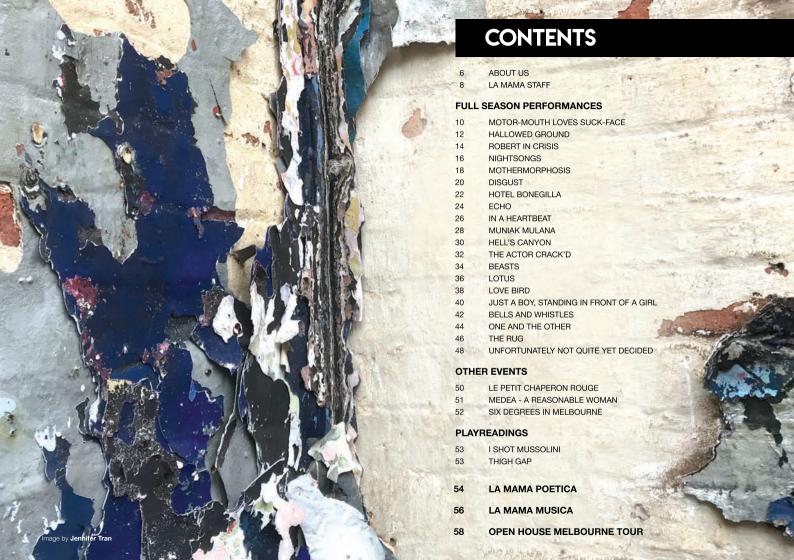
Guerin Inc, Resolution X, Power Stage, PRD Music Services, Concert Lighting Systems and Lisa Inman, thank you.
