since 2012, including several projects with Little Ones Theatre Company, multiple lighting designs with various companies and working as an associate to many Australian designers. In recent months they relit Circus Oz's tour of Rock Bang featuring Die Roten Punkte; worked on Broadway transfers Harry Potter and the Cursed Child and Come From Away, the Australian tour of War Horse, several pieces for White Night Reimagined (Melbourne); lit two productions for the Federation University Acting program, and is soon to transfer the 2020 Australian tour of Billy Elliot to Melbourne.

BEN ROY KEENE is a composer, recordist and sound designer. He graduated with distinction from the RMIT Digital Media Course in 2016 and was awarded the RMIT Higher Education Award. He is currently a casual academic and completing his Honours degree at RMIT. His theatre sound design credits include the Melbourne Theatre Company, Expressions Dance Company, TheatreWorks, Hoy Polloy, Big West Festival, and the impossible project. He works closely with

Darrin Verhagen as a research assistant at AkE Lab and collaborator on many projects. He is a member of FINUCANE SMITH, collaborating on productions including INTIMATE 8 at the NGV and THE FLOOD at XiXi international theatre festival in Shanghai. In 2019 he contributed to the PRAGUE QUADRENNIAL as part of Australia's contribution.

WRITER/DIRECTOR'S NOTES | JACK O'BRIEN

The Circle was born of my love for roleplaying games, taking willing participants or "players" through a world, and challenging them with adventure. Or, in some cases, giving them awful, awful choices, all in the safe space of collective fiction. Choices no human should be able to make. Like, do I bomb this city to stop a war? Do I let this house burn to grab the treasure? Do I let the love of my life end the world?

The Circle is my child, and like most children, it has been a snot nosed, arrogant and aggravating little punk. My true hope is that when you're done, you'll agree that we told a good story. Not a good queer story, not a good horror story, but a good story period. I hope it starts conversations, I hope it provokes thought, and, ultimately, that you have a good time.

As I always say to my players: If you had fun, I had fun.

JACK O'BRIEN is an actor, voice actor, dungeon master and writer based in Melbourne. Victoria. With a Bachelor of Arts in Applied Theatre under his belt as well as a Distinction and Best in State (QLD) award for Trinity College- Jack proceeded to wow audiences across Australia.
