### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

A clown walks onto the stage. They are alone, but not lonely. Many people are drawn to performing in the style of clown. WHY? The answer can only be: Because. There's no point spending time asking psychology or intellectualism why people want to practice clown. They just DO. It just IS. The clown is THERE. And always will be. Dancing around in the fringes of the theatre world.

Learning to be with and play with one's aloneness is a thrilling process. As we play in the aloneness, we begin to see what is bursting to be played. We find one's own unique stupidity. There is no reason for stupidity - again - why? Because. It is just there. Those great fears of being human 'Am I being too much? Or am I not enough?' We can't win, but we can play. Underneath our masks of perfectionisms, heroisms, personality-isms there is one immense fool. A stupendous, remarkable, mind-boggling idiot.

But, beware, the stupidest thing a clown could ever think is that their stupidity is private. No, no, no, no, no. Gifts are much more fun to share. When we are gifted such an idiot persona it is to be shared. It itches to be shared. It will scratch at the back of our knees until it can step into the light! Ahh, the initiation - adorning the end of the nose with a sphere of red plastic!

When the idiot is truly initiated they have become brave, brave enough to do something very scary, to stand there, alone, to look people in the eye, and to simply be one big-huge-absolute-unforgettable-unmistakable dingus.
